As we move through the beautiful months of October and November, we enter a traditional season of thanksgiving and reflection, and we have much to be grateful for. We want to express deep gratitude for the generous gifts that were received this year, as these unexpected donations have been instrumental in helping the church maintain operations.

We have been privileged to witness God's work through our church's mission and ministry over the past year.

Our efforts in missions and outreach have been vibrant. For instance, the July MyCalling! event was a great success. Several teams completed sites including mucking out stells at White Ring Forms, multiple gardens.

meaningful service across five sites, including mucking out stalls at White Pine Farms; mulching gardens and rearranging the nurse's office at Sacred Heart in Camden, NJ; cleaning the deck and interacting with those living in the memory care facility at Chandler Hall; and packing food bags at Mercer Street Friends. Additionally, the they made improvements right here at Yardley UMC by sanding and painting the Gaga pit and building and painting new benches, and replacing the shed roof. Looking ahead, we are excited about the ongoing MyCalling! ministry and looking to reach out to other's involvement in the coming year.

We have released our Annual Narrative Budget. This document is intended to be a visual guide to the church's mission, finances, and ministry areas. It includes specific notations, such as the desire for a larger and more meaningful missions and outreach budget and full funding for pizza dinners. This document features recent pictures from church events. We trust this comprehensive guide will help all congregants have a clearer understanding of how funds are used to support our mission.

As we approach the close of 2025, we encourage every member to **review your faithfulness toward your giving commitments.** Being transparent about our current financial standing is essential. Through August, our year-to-date income is at 67% of the annual goal. However, to understand our regular giving patterns, it is important to note that without the large, unbudgeted donations received this year, **the actual income from commitments is only at 47% of the annual budget.** 

We currently face a **significant projected budget shortfall** for the final months of the year. While we are grateful that the church currently has 28 pledges, however, \$38,250 of pledged income is expected for the rest of 2025. With our monthly operating expenses running at approximately \$33,000, the remaining pledged income is only enough to cover about one month's worth of expenses. **This means we project being short for November, and December.** 

We know that many members often wait until the end of the year, or until they receive a statement, to catch up on their commitments. We urgently request that all members make an effort to stay current on your giving commitments to support the church through the end of the year. We are asking the congregation to consider your giving for 2025 to help mitigate the immediate risk of a significant funding gap.

We encourage all members to examine their giving commitments. If you have further questions regarding our financial status, please direct them to the finance committee. Let us embrace this season with both an attitude of thanksgiving and a commitment to faithful giving to our local family of faith and our mission to create and gather faithful followers of Jesus Christ who love and serve their neighbors.






# Charge Conference is Tuesday, Oct 28 at 6 pm at YUMC


## New 30-Day Devotional: The Slow Path to Wisdom


Each week, I am in awe of the people God brings to the building and the way we care for one another and our ministries. I wish everyone could experience Wednesday evenings at YUMC!
